5. GROUP CLASS OR INDIVIDUAL LESSONS?

Our group classes, unlike any other group classes offered currently on the market, offer individualized instruction in a group setting: every student is taught individually and allowed to learn at their own pace and level. Group classes are a great starting point to find out if the child is really interested in an instrument. Our classes are 30 minutes long and have only 2 students in each class.

The student can continue group classes for many years. Both children and adults can successfully learn in a group class setting.

For voice students, group classes are an excellent choice up to age 10-11. After that, the student should move into individual lessons so that the teacher can accommodate their unique vocal needs.

Group class students are eligible to participate in our student recitals, NMA Annual Exams, and IMA Competition.

Individual lessons are great for students who are interested in learning, enjoy regular practicing at home, and who want to participate in some of our more demanding programs. Because the student is under teacher's supervision for the entire 30 minutes of the lesson, individual lessons have more homework and require more practicing at home. Also, preparation for IL State Exams in piano, violin and voice can be done only in individual lessons. These lessons are also a better fit for students who would have a hard time focusing in a group setting. Students who are not ready to commit to almost daily practice would be better served in a group class.
