Illinois State Voice Exams On-Line and in Person in 2020-2021

What are the benefits of taking AIM examinations?

These exams enhance musicianship, develop performance confidence, and **make a significant difference in college application process and employment search.** Now that **many universities have phased out standardized tests,** more focus is placed on the students with extensive and relevant extracurricular activities, especially music. The same is true of the employers. They know that music training is demanding, time consuming and requires highly developed cognitive and analytical skills, as well as long term planning. These are valuable skills for demanding college programs or employment.

AIM exams are demanding and require daily instrument practice and theory study. The goal is for students to have a positive experience and feel rewarded for their dedication and diligent work. Students receive a certificate for successful completion of the theory and the performance exams. Students can start from any level they are able to pass successfully and can do 2 levels per year with longer lessons and sufficient practice.

Lesson Requirements

Due to the extensive and complex nature of these exams, they can be prepared in individual lessons only.

Individual lesson requirements per level: 1-4 = 30 min lesson; 5-8 = 45 min lesson. **Combining multiple levels: there will be a special mandatory lesson length requirement decided on the level combined.**

Regular tuition rates apply.

Deadlines

Please inform your teacher about your intention to take the exam as soon as possible. Early preparation is the key to good scores. Signup deadlines are in the early spring. NMA will send e-mails to all voice students to let them know when the signup starts.

Voice Exam Dates for academic year 2020-2021.

Sunday, May 2, 2021. Musicianship skills in person, at NMA, performance exam through video submissions.

Are there any age limitations?

Lowest age for voice AIM exams is 10.

Who are the NMA teachers participating in exam preparation?

Individual voice lessons: Ms. Jenna Hintz, Ms. Eunice Ayodele and Dr. Sonja Mihelcic.

How are the exams structured?

AIM examinations are divided by level and content. There are specific technique, theory, and repertoire requirements for each level. Both the theory portion and the performance portion of the exam are done on the same day. Please consult your teacher about the exam level most appropriate for your child.

Where are the AIM voice examinations held?

The exams are held on the NMA premises. You will receive the exam time information from your teacher about a week ahead.

Who adjudicates the examinations?

Members of Music Teacher National Association in our area are the adjudicators at AIM examinations. They are experienced teachers and adjudicators

Are there any extra fees for AIM examinations and materials?

Yes, for levels 1-2, there is a participation fee of \$25 per student per exam, and this fee covers both the theory and the performance portion of the exam. For levels 3-8, there is a \$20 for theory portion of the exam, and \$20 fee for the performance portion. The fees are due at registration, payable by check or cash. For credit card payments there is an additional \$3 processing fee. Books needed for exam preparation are at additional costs.

How do I register?

You will be registering with your teacher directly. NMA facilitates the organization of this program and collects the fees, but an individual teacher needs to be a member of MTNA in order to enter the students into the AIM exams.
